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Learning Disability Criteria Information Sheet

Players attending the trials should be under 18 as at 1st September 2009

Eligible players must have an intellectual disability as defined by the World Health Organisation (WHN). To meet this standard, a persons IQ must be within or below the range of 70-75.

Players should have supported education / educational statement. If this information is not accessible a letter from a SENCO, College's LDD or Learning Support Department stating that the player has a Learning Disability will be accepted.

For clarification, Dyslexia is recognised as a learning difficulty and not a learning disability. Players who have Dyslexia but no associated learning disability will not be permitted to play.

ADHD is a medical condition. Players with ADHD and no associated learning disability will not be permitted to play.

However we can only be guided by the experts, therefore if a school or college believe the player has learning disability then we should not question.

All selected players will be subject to the UKSAPLD national eligibility criteria and must pass to play in the tournament.
